The Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program at the University of Lynchburg is designed to train entry-level physical therapists to practice in a variety of clinical settings. You'll get hands-on, experiential learning in small, intimate classes and benefit from a student-centered approach.

This is where you'll develop skills as an ethical, in-demand health care practitioner whose work makes a direct impact on people's lives — 100% of our graduates find a job within a year.

The University has established partnerships with regional health care providers and major health care-related businesses. These relationships give Lynchburg DPT students the opportunity to get in the field and take on increasing levels of patient care and responsibility.

- An anatomy lab with up to 21 cadavers for in-depth exploration of the human body in a small group setting.
- Fully equipped classrooms, laboratories, research lab, and skill acquisition areas.
- The University of Lynchburg Community
 Health Center, a student-run physical therapy
 clinic that serves local patients in need.
