AAPA's Degree Pathway Program This program through AAPA includes modules on leadership and management to prepare students for attaining an advanced degree. The Lynchburg DMSc is the first doctoral degree with this partnership.

Centra This regional health care system, serving more than 380,000 people in Virginia, offers Lynchburg DMSc candidates access to four hospitals, a regional cancer center, and a cardiovascular care and surgery center.

DMSC TRACKS

DMSc Advanced Professional Practice Concentration

This DMSc program can be completed simultaneously while you work as a PA at your current place of employment or with one of Lynchburg's partners.

DMSc Medical Education Concentration

This is the first accredited doctoral program offering a curriculum tailored to the unique challenges of PA educators. It can be completed by those working full time in PA education or by clinicians aspiring to become future educators.

DMSc Emergency Management and Global Health Concentration

This program prepares frontline providers for emergencies and global-scale crises. Its final component is a 7-10 day intensive, held in person near Lynchburg's campus to apply learned skills to a real-life situation.

DMSc Administrative Medicine Concentration

Coursework for this program synthesizes leadership and business skills with other areas of administrative expertise, rounding out qualifications for those seeking to fill a dual role as a clinician and administrator.

What are the criteria for admission?

- Master's or doctoral degree from a regionally accredited institution.
- Minimum overall graduate cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Active licensure and/or certification as a PA professional.
- Letter of recommendation.

What is the cost of the program?

Lynchburg's DMSc program is an affordable option for PAs who want to advance their careers and be leaders in the health care field.

Will students be required to travel to Lynchburg?

No. Course content is completed online. Fellowships and scholarly projects are completed offline at your place of employment. Students are encouraged to travel to campus to attend graduation in May. The Emergency Management and Global Health concentration concludes with a 7-10 day intensive, held in person near Lynchburg.

What is the interface for online course delivery? What type of technology resources will I need?

Lynchburg uses Moodle for online teaching. Students will need access to a reliable computer and high-speed internet.

How does a student know which courses to take for their program of study?

The DMSc program is a cohort-based program. A program advisor will enroll students in the appropriate program of study.

What about CME?

Earn up to 120 AAPA Category 1 CME credits for completing courses in the core degree curriculum! By completing normal coursework and a post-activity evaluation for select learning modules in the relevant DMSc courses, students earn both their doctorate and up to two years' worth of continuing education.
